

If 19 pupils left for Camelot Theme Park but two had to go home how many actually arrived? Sounds like a set up for a Maths question!

As it happens the trip to Camelot, near Chorley, WAS a Maths trip with the new S4! The purpose was to find out about the mathematics behind some of the rides within the park and to learn about the data used by the company to inform financial planning and customer safety.



One interesting fact was that the company expects to book a profit of just 8% in 2011 - a sign of the times perhaps. After the presentation the pupils were able to experience the rides themselves including the "Knightmare" which was voted 6th best roller coaster in the world by one survey. In addition to the other rides, and the jousting at the arena, there was a Maths trail that the pupils could follow further reinforcing the use of Maths in a practical setting.

The queues were short, the rides were fun but all too soon it was time to come home. The pupils were a credit to the school and as result of their enthusiasm we hope to be able to run more maths trips in the future.

The group spent another half an hour exploring the other exhibits in hanger 4.

June 2011 saw the start of the new P7/S1 transition programme at Whitburn Academy. P7 pupils attended a 3-day event that covered all aspects of school life.

Heartlands

Credit Union...

Over the past two years, Blackburn, Seafield and District Credit Union have been coming into Whitburn Academy to make weekly collections on a Thursday morning at interval.



Pupils are issued with a payment book, and can save from as little as 10p. This service increases awareness of the importance of saving, and can help pupils save towards things such as holidays and Christmas, as well as towards school events such as trips, the prom, etc. The service is run by employees of the Credit Union, assisted by a group of pupils.

This is a cross- curricular initiative which started with a presentation by Mr Alex Muirhead; Heartlands Project Manager. Pupils were encouraged to ask him questions about the project and how it will affect them and the community of Whitburn.

In History they have been learning about the coal mine at Polkemmet and how mining has affected Whitburn's heritage. In Geography the pupils have been looking at the location of the Heartlands and examining the social, economic and environmental impacts of the development. In Modern Studies pupils will learn how the Heartlands will have to cater for the leisure and lifestyle needs of all members of the community. In Religion and Philosophy pupils will look at how the Heartlands community can contribute to tackling environmental problems.

Measles Alert...

There has been a recent increase in the numbers of measles cases in Scotland and the rest of the UK, mainly affecting teenagers and younger adults. Many of the cases have been associated with recent travel abroad especially to France. A number of current measles outbreaks have been reported from France, Belgium and Switzerland.

Measles is highly infectious and can be a dangerous illness. It spreads easily in schools, universities and summer camps. Those who are not fully immunised with two doses of MMR are most at risk of developing measles.

As we approach the time of year when many children and students are travelling abroad on summer trips and family holidays, NHS Lothian is urging parents to protect their children against measles. If your child has missed out on two doses of MMR vaccine please consider getting your child fully immunised with MMR before you travel abroad during the summer break. Please contact your GP or practice nurse to arrange MMR vaccination as soon as possible.
